

Manitoba 150 Host Committee

May 12, 2020 marked 150 years since the Manitoba Act received royal assent, paving the way for Manitoba to become Canada's fifth province. The Manitoba 150 Host Committee is engaging Manitobans in the yearlong celebration of this momentous milestone. Due to the COVID-19 pandemic, all Manitoba 150 programming was shifted to 2021.

Manitoba 150 aims to support initiatives that cultivate pride in our province, foster a profound connection with our diverse cultures and, above all, unite us in celebration.

What is Tour 150: Nakatamaakewin?

Tour 150 is presented by Manitoba's Credit Unions and features Nakatamaakewin, a retrofit, completely accessible van that will travel across the province to communities and schools from May to September 2021. Nakatamaakewin [na-kah-tah-MAA-kaywin] is a Michif name gifted by Language Keeper and Elder Verna Demontigny meaning "to leave something behind," Tour 150 honours the homeland of the Métis Nation and offers the flexibility to leave behind inspiration and learning from many cultures in future years.

As part of the celebration of our province's 150th anniversary, the Manitoba 150 Host Committee has partnered with the Winnipeg Art Gallery (WAG) to bring Inuit art to communities across the province this summer.
